Intake Services
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These services are provided by Northern Rivers Family of Services and member agencies.

Students attending Northern Rivers' Day Education program live at home and receive intensive counseling and clinician support from professional staff at the Student Counseling Center, which is located next to the School at Northeast in Schenectady. The school is a coed special education program for 152 students in grades 6–12. Our students have not succeeded in a traditional public school setting and come to receive the support they need to graduate from high school.

Education Services

- Self-contained special education classrooms
- Departmentalized middle and high school curriculum
- A comprehensive behavior management system based on the Boys' Town Social Skills Program
- Collaboration with Capital Region BOCES to implement Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) system throughout the school
- Staff trained in Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI)
- Liaison to Committees on Special Education

Clinical Services

- Weekly individual and group counseling
- Biweekly family counseling
- Comprehensive assessment of the child's behavior, family history, education, and health
- Individual education plans and crisis management plans to address each student's and family's unique needs
- Social, developmental, and independent living skills building
- Linkage with outside services and assistance with advocating for treatment opportunities
- Collaboration with other providers to ensure service continuity
- Visits to the home to prevent truancy and increase family involvement
- Qualified nursing staff
- Case management
- Extracurricular activities that promote social development
- School-to-work program
- Transitional planning and support to promote success after grad.

Benefits

- Intensive support to families to reduce barriers to student learning
- Assistance to help families access other services in the community
- Intensive supports to help ensure academic success for students
- Assistance to families when program is not in operation

The Day Education program follows the Schenectady City School's regular school calendar (September–June) and provides services for a 6-week summer program (July–August) for those students in need of credit retention, remediation, and/or additional behavioral support.
